### *Psychology*

#### **Research Guides**

The Psychologist's Companion: A Guide to Scientific Writing for Students and Researchers (CLStacks BF76.8 S73 1993)

Provides basic information that students and professionals can utilize to write in the field of psychology. Chapters include steps in writing the library research paper, misused words, guidelines for data presentation, submitting a paper to a journal, writing a grant, writing a lecture.

Psychology: A Guide to Reference and Information Sources (Baxter) (Ref BF121.B391993)

Introduces user to major sources in psychology published from 1970 to 1991. Types of reference sources recommended include guides, bibliographies, handbooks, dictionaries and encyclopedias, indexing tools, online databases, journals, organizations, directories, etc.

#### **Encyclopedias and Dictionaries**

The Corsini Encyclopedia of Psychology and Behavioral Science (Ref BF31.E52 2001 Vols. 1-4)  
Arranged alphabetically by topic. Most entries include references and cross references. Author index in volume 4.

Encyclopedia of Psychology (by Kazdin) (Ref BF31.E52 2000) 8 volumes

Published jointly by the American Psychological Association and Oxford University Press. Entries are arranged alphabetically, and include extensive cross-references and bibliographies. Comprehensive index in Volume 8.

Encyclopedia of Psychology (ed. by Corsini) (CLstacks BF31.E52 1994) 4 volumes

Alphabetical arrangement of more than 2100 articles on topics and persons in all areas of psychology. Volume 4 contains biographies, a bibliography, name index, subject index and appendices.

The Gale Encyclopedia of Psychology (Ref BF31.G35 2001)

Includes over 650 entries on people and key concepts. Arranged alphabetically. Entries include cross-references and sources for further reading. Volume contains glossary of 350 terms and a list of psychological organizations.

Encyclopedia of Human Behavior (Ref BF31.E5 1994) 4 volumes

Presents 250 articles on human behavior focusing on physiological, abnormal and clinical psychology and cognition. Each article includes a glossary and bibliography. Volume 4 includes author, title and subject indexes.

Encyclopedia of Mental Health (ed. By Friedman) (Ref RA790.5 E53 1998) 3 volumes  
Covers current topics such as depression, schizophrenia, mood disorders, mental retardation, dementia, panic attacks, somatization, conduct disorder, dissociative disorders, etc. Addresses the intersecting forces that constitute mental health. Arranged alphabetically by subject. Each article contains an outline, glossary, cross-references and a bibliography. Comprehensive index at the end of Volume 3.

Companion Encyclopedia of Psychology (CLstacks 150.3 C737 1994) 2 volumes  
Covers all major branches of psychology research and professional practice with contributions by 70 authors. Arranged into 13 sections that include the history of the discipline, biological aspects, cognition, learning, emotion, personality, etc.

Encyclopedia of Human Emotions (Ref BF531.E55 1999) 2 volumes  
Alphabetical arrangement of articles about all aspects and current trends relating to human emotions. Intended for beginning researchers and those who are confronting emotional issues in their lives and want background information.

The MIT Encyclopedia of the Cognitive Sciences (Ref BF311.M556 1999)  
Consists of nearly 500 articles with lists of references and further readings. The articles are divided into the six fields that constitute the foundation of the cognitive sciences: philosophy, psychology, neuroscience, computational intelligence, linguistics and language, and culture, cognition and evolution.

Animal Behavior Desk Reference (Barrows) (Ref QL750.3 B37 1995)  
Annotated dictionary for the fields of animal behavior, evolution, ecology and related branches in biology. Conceptual terms are emphasized, not anatomical parts or taxonomic names. Summarizes relationships among terms and many are organized in hierarchical clusters.

A Student's Dictionary of Psychology (Ref BF31.S69 1999)  
Intended as a guide for students, particularly those who are studying psychology for the first time. Includes major terms, biographical sketches and a bibliography.

Concise Encyclopedia of Psychology (ed. by Corsini) (Ref BF31.C67 1998)  
Contains abbreviated versions of most of the entries of the four-volume encyclopedia. All entries are updated and revised to keep abreast of the changing field of psychology. Arranged alphabetically.

Encyclopedia of Mental Health (Kahn)(Ref RC437.K34 2001)  
Arranged alphabetically, provides short articles some with references. Includes cross references, a list of resources, an extensive bibliography and a general index.

Learning and Memory (Ref BF318.E53 2003)  
Contains articles with references pertaining to all aspects of learning and memory. Arranged alphabetically. Also includes biographical sketches and a general index.

## **Biographical Dictionary**

Biographical Dictionary of Psychology (Ref BF109.A1 B56 1997)

Provides information and analysis of influence of over 500 psychologists and other individuals worldwide whose work has had a profound impact on the development of the discipline. Arranged alphabetically, each biography includes birth/death dates, nationality, education, awards and honors. Also included are principal publications, and a list of critical resources for further reading.

## **Indexes/Abstracts to Periodical Articles**

PsycINFO (electronic database)

Most comprehensive index to literature of psychology. Indexes and abstracts (summarizes) more than 1200 journals and reports some since the late 1800's. Also includes coverage of books, chapters and dissertations.

Psychology and Behavioral Science Collection (EBSCO) (electronic database)

Includes full text articles from more than 460 journals in psychology, mental health, and behavioral sciences. Most of the journals are peer reviewed.

PsycARTICLES (electronic database)

Contains more than 25,000 full text articles from over 40 journals published by the American Psychological Assn. and allied organizations.

Academic Search (EBSCO) (electronic database)

Provides full text for nearly 3,000 scholarly publications including social sciences, humanities, education, computer sciences, engineering, language and linguistics, arts and literature, health sciences, and ethnic studies.

## **Handbooks**

Handbook of Research and Quantitative Methods in Psychology: For Students and Professionals (Ref BF76.5 H34 1986)

Handbook and dictionary to terms and concepts frequently used in research. Includes charts and tables of random numbers, symbols, conversion values, etc. Dictionary provides brief, clear definitions of terms used in statistical methods and psychometrics.

Psychologists' Desk Reference (Koocher) (Ref RC467.2 P78 1998)

Concisely presents essential information for clinicians. Contains diagnostic codes, text information, report checklists, practice guidelines, treatment principles, ethics refreshers, legal regulations, etc. Includes comprehensive index.

Handbook of Psychology (Freedheim) (Ref BF121.H1955 2003) 12 volumes

Volumes are entitled: History of Psychology, Research Methods in Psychology, Biological Psychology, Experimental Psychology, Personality & Social Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Educational Psychology, Clinical Psychology, Health Psychology, Assessment Psychology, Forensic Psychology, Industrial & Organizational Psychology

## **Education and Professional Directories**

### Directory of the American Psychological Association (Ref BF11.A67 2001)

Lists more than 73,000 names of association members and provides brief biographical data. Includes geographical index and divisional membership.

### Graduate Programs in Psychology 2002 (Ref BF80.7 U6 G74)

Profiles accredited master's and doctoral programs in psychology; includes tips when applying; and advice on financial aid. Arranged into seventeen subject fields within psychology

### Graduate Study in Psychology 2003 (APA) (Ref BF77.G73)

Provides information for more than 500 graduate department, programs and schools of psychology in the US and Canada. Arranged by state. Includes index of programs by area of study and an alphabetical index of institutions.

## **Tests and Test Critiques**

### The...Mental Measurements Yearbook (Ref BF176.M46)

Published by Buros Institute of Mental Measurements, The University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Numerous volumes to date. Provides descriptive information, references and critical reviews of tests. Includes test title index, subject index, publishers index, name index (names of authors of tests), acronym index and score index. Categories of tests include personality, achievement, behavior assessment, education, science, etc. Online access through <http://buros.unl.edu/buros/jsp/search.jsp>.

### Test Critiques (Ref BF176.T418)

Numerous volumes. Each volume contains about 100 reviews of commercial tests most frequently used in psychological assessment, business and education. Reviews include description of development and application of test, technical data, critique and list of references. Includes test title, publisher, author/reviewer and subject indexes. Indexes are cumulative beginning with volume 3. See also the Test Critiques Compendium (Ref BF176.T4195) Online access through <http://buros.unl.edu/buros/jsp/search.jsp>.

### Handbook of Psychological Assessment (Goldstein) (CLstacks BF39.H2645 2000)

Collection of over 20 articles on various topics in psychological assessment including test construction, interest inventories, neuropsychological assessment, interviewing, behavioral assessment and intervention.

### Handbook of Psychological Assessment (Groth-Marnat) (CLstacks BF176.G76 2003)

Summarizes psychological measures. Includes bibliography and indexes.

### Measures for Clinical Practice: A Sourcebook (Corcoran) (Ref BF176.C66 2000) 2 volumes

Purpose is to provide practitioners and students with a number of instruments that can be used to monitor and evaluate clinical practice. Those included measure most of the common problems in clinical practice, they are relatively short and are easy to score and administer. Volume 1: couples, families and children. Volume 2: adults with problems outside the context of the family. (1987 edition in CLstacks)

Tests: A Comprehensive Reference for Assessments in Psychology, Education, and Business (Ref BF176.T43, 2003; 1986, 1991 & 1997 editions in the stacks, same call number)

Designed for psychologists, educators and human resource personnel, provides concise descriptions of more than 700 new or revised tests. Indexes include title, out-of-print, hearing and visually impaired, foreign language, computer-scored, author and publisher.

Dictionary of Psychological Testing, Assessment and Treatment: Includes Key Terms in Statistics, Psychological Testing, Experimental Methods and Therapeutic Treatments (Stuart-Hamilton) (Ref BF176.S78 1995)

Guide to the commonly-used tests, experimental methods and analyses, and therapies. Brief entries are arranged alphabetically, some with cross-references.

Handbook of Psychiatric Measures (Ref RC473.P78 A46 2000)

Designed for clinicians and policy makers, provides information about the selection, use and interpretation of over 200 formal assessments. References and suggested readings are provided with each assessment description. Appendices include a list of advisors, DSM-IV-TR classification, list of measures included in the accompanying CD-ROM, alphabetical index of measures, index of abbreviations for measures. Also includes a general index.

Encyclopedia of Psychological Assessment (Ref BF176.E53 2003) 2 volumes

Arranged alphabetically, discusses assessment and individual measurement instruments in areas such as attachment, cognitive processes, development, emotions, identity, leadership, memory, problem-solving, quality of life. Includes general index.

ERIC Clearinghouse for Assessment and Evaluation (<http://ericae.net> until 12/03 then use <http://edresearch.org>)

One of 16 subject-oriented clearinghouses of ERIC. Addresses educational research and measurement methodology in theory and in practice.

# *Psychiatry*

## **Encyclopedias**

International Encyclopedia of Psychiatry, Psychology, Psychoanalysis, & Neurology (Ref RC334.I57) 12 volumes

Includes more than 1800 articles providing authoritative and comprehensive information in most areas of psychology. Emphasizes theoretical, experimental and therapeutic approaches.

Encyclopedia of Psychiatry, Psychology and Psychoanalysis (Ref RC437.E49 1996)

This is an update to International Encyclopedia of Psychiatry, Psychology, Psychoanalysis, & Neurology. In abridged form and intended for faculty, clinicians and graduate students. Offers authoritative, complete and up-to-date description of research, theory and practice in the sciences and professions that deal with the human mind and its ills.

Encyclopedia of Psychotherapy (Hersen) (Ref RC475.7 E537 2002) 2 volumes

Arranged alphabetically. Articles include references and topics include Anger Control Therapy, Anxiety Management Training, Behavioral Marital Therapy, Bioethics, Classical Conditioning, Dialectical Behavior Therapy, Eating Disorders, Emotive Imagery, Interpersonal Psychotherapy, Logotherapy, Modeling, Neurobiology, Omission Training, etc. Includes general index.

Gale Encyclopedia of Mental Disorders (Ref RC437.G35 2003) 2 volumes

Topical articles are arranged alphabetically and each includes Resources for further study. Intends to inform readers about a variety of mental disorders, diagnostic techniques and tests, therapies, and psychiatric medications. Topics include Agoraphobia, Alzheimer's disease, Anxiety disorders, Borderline personality disorder, Clinical assessment scales for the elderly, Clozapine, Compulsion, Hypnotherapy, Meditation, Narcolepsy, etc.

## **Handbooks and Manuals**

American Handbook of Psychiatry (CLstacks RC435.A562) 7 volumes

Covers foundations of psychiatry child/adolescent/community psychiatry, adult psychiatry, organic disorders/psychosomatic medicine, treatment, new frontiers, new directions, and biological psychiatry. Name and subject index in each volume.

Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders: DSM-IV (Ref RC455.2 C4 D54 1994)

Provides descriptions of diagnostic categories of mental disorders. Includes the DSM-IV Classification (lists official codes and categories); description of the multi-axial system for diagnosis; criteria and description for each of the disorders; and numerous appendices.

Drug Information Handbook for Psychiatry (Fuller) (Ref RC483.F87 1999)

Alphabetically arranged, quick reference including commonly-used drugs. Also includes section on special topics (psychiatric assessment, major disorders, issues in the use of major medications, patient information for medications, index on pharmacologic categories).

Harvard Guide to Psychiatry (Ref RC454.N47 1999)

Intended for clinicians and researchers, the text reviews recent findings on the development of the mind, its complex relationship with the body and the diagnosis and treatment of its disorders. Organized into six parts: Examination and Evaluation, Brain and Behavior, Psychopathology, Principles of Treatment and Management, Special Populations, and Psychiatry and Society. Extensive references and subject index.

Manual of Clinical Psychopharmacology (Ref RC483.S37 2003)

Compatible with DSM-IV, provides concise and updated guidance for the selection and prescription of appropriate drug therapy for individual patients. Reviews all classes of psycho-medications and includes updated information on the effects and dosages.
